AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 90 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF CALUMET CITY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Calumet City, Cook County, Illinois, by and through its home rule powers, as follows:

Section 1. That Section 90-317 (Handicapped parking) of Article V [Stopping, Standing and Parking] of Chapter 90 [Traffic and Vehicles] of the Municipal Code of Calumet City, Illinois, is hereby amended by adding the following language to subsection G (Signed areas) to read, as follows:

Section 2. The Commissioner of Streets and Alleys is hereby authorized and directed to install the proper signs in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Ordinance.

Section 3. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any other provision of this Ordinance.

Section 4. All ordinances, resolutions, motions or orders in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

416 Madison Avenue

- Section 2. The Commissioner of Streets and Alleys is hereby authorized and directed to remove such signs in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Ordinance.
- **Section 3**. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any other provision of this Ordinance.
 - **Section 4.** All ordinances, resolutions, motions or orders in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.
 - **Section 5.** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE REZONING OF PROPERTY COMMONLY KNOWN AS 508 PULASKI ROAD FROM B-1 COMMERCIAL DISTRICT TO R-2 RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT IN THE CITY OF CALUMET CITY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS

WHEREAS, the City of Calumet City, Cook County, Illinois (the "City") is a home rule municipality pursuant to Section 6(a), Article VII of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois, and as such may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs (the "Home Rule Powers"); and

WHEREAS, Waymon L. Docks (the "Applicant"), the prospective owner pursuant to a contract to purchase the property commonly known as 508 Pulaski Road, Calumet City, Illinois, which is legally described on Exhibit A (the "Property"), a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof, filed a petition requesting a map amendment to rezone the Property from B-1 Commercial District to R-2 Residential District; and

WHEREAS, the Zoning Board of Appeals (the "Zoning Board") caused the appropriate notices to be published and mailed in accordance with the City Code; and

WHEREAS, on October 6, 2016, the Zoning Board held a public hearing to hear testimony and consider said petition, along with all other requested and supporting documents submitted by the Applicant; and

WHEREAS, after an examination of the issues and exhibits as well as the testimony presented before the Zoning Board, the members of the Zoning Board deliberated and recommended the zoning map amendment to the Mayor and City Council of the City of Calumet City (the "Corporate Authorities").

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Calumet City, Cook County, Illinois, by and through its Home Rule Powers, as follows:

Section 1. That the above recitals and legislative findings are found to be true and correct and are hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as if fully set forth in their entirety.

Section 2. The written findings of fact and recommendation of the Zoning Board relative to the petition to rezone the Property are hereby accepted and incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as Exhibit B, as if fully set forth in their entirety. All documents and exhibits submitted at the aforesaid public hearing are also incorporated by reference into this Ordinance.

Section 3. The Property, in accordance with the findings of fact and recommendations of the Zoning Board as herein set forth, is hereby rezoned from B-1 Commercial District to R-2 Residential District and the zoning map of the City is hereby amended in accordance thereof.

Section 4. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any other provision of this Ordinance.

Section 5. All ordinances, resolutions, motions or orders in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 6. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.
