OF THE CITY OF CALUMET CITY, ILLINOIS FIRE

**DEPARTMENT** 

WHEREAS, the Foreign Fire Insurance Fee Act requires insurance carriers not

incorporated under the laws of the State of Illinois to pay a foreign fire insurance license fee to

Illinois fire department foreign fire insurance boards and Illinois fire protection districts; and

WHEREAS, the Illinois Municipal League has developed a program to collect and

distribute the 2% foreign fire insurance license fee paid by insurance carriers to fire department

foreign fire insurance boards and fire protection districts; and

WHEREAS, the Foreign Fire Insurance License Fee Act provides that the Illinois

Municipal League shall be the default entity to collect foreign fire insurance license fees for any

entity entitled to the fees that does not collect the fees on its own accord or through a designee;

and

WHEREAS, this program is of the benefit to the Foreign Fire Insurance Board of the City

of Calumet City Illinois Fire Department.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and City Council of Calumet

City, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION 1. That the Illinois Municipal League is hereby authorized by the Board to

receive and examine the reports and collect the payments of the two percent (2%) foreign fire

insurance license fees tendered to this Board by foreign fire insurance companies.

SECTION 2. That the Illinois Municipal League shall keep an accurate and complete

record of all such fee payments received from foreign fire insurance companies and the

distribution of such payments to treasurer of this Board and that all such records shall be open to

the inspection of the members of this Board during reasonable office hours.

**SECTION 3.** That this Board hereby authorizes and designates the Illinois Municipal

League to act as its sole agent for the collection of the rightfully imposed foreign fire insurance

license fee of two percent (2%) per annum of the gross receipts received as premiums on fire

insurance policies on properties within the jurisdiction. The Board hereby agrees to pay as an

annual service charge to the Illinois Municipal League five percent (5%) of the fees actually

collected, or such other amount as may be necessary and agreed to in writing. The Illinois

Municipal League service charge shall be deducted prior to distributing the annual fee proceeds to

the Board. The Illinois Municipal League is authorized to take necessary actions and carry on all

necessary communication with the foreign fire insurance companies owing fees on behalf of this

Board. The Illinois Municipal League shall remain the designated agent until notified by this Board

by adopted resolution of this Board rescinding this agreement and engagement.

SECTION 4. That the City Clerk be hereby authorized and directed to retain a copy of this

Resolution in the Clerk's office for public inspection.

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## ORDINANCE NO. 23-12

## AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 90, ARTICLE V, DIVISION 1 OF THE CALUMET CITY MUNICIPAL CODE – HANDICAPPED PARKING

WHEREAS, Calumet City is an Illinois home rule unit of local government with authority to legislate in matters concerning its local government and affairs.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of Calumet City, Cook County, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1. That the Calumet City Municipal Code is hereby amended to add the underlined text and/or delete text as indicated:

### Section 90-317. - Handicapped parking.

- (a) Generally, There shall be designated by the city council, from time to time, areas prohibiting parking by any person other than a handicapped person. Any person other than a handicapped person who parks in said designated areas shall violate the provisions of this section and shall be subject to the penalty provided for by ordinance.
- (b) Definitions.
  - (1) The following persons shall be classified as handicapped persons relating to the use of handicapped parking spaces in the city:
    - a. Any natural person who has temporarily or permanently lost the use of one (1) or both legs.
    - b. Any natural person who is temporarily or permanently disabled to a degree where such person is unable to move without the aid of some mechanical device such as crutches or a wheelchair or the aid of another person.

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- c. Any motor vehicle bearing registration plates issued to a physically handicapped person pursuant to 625 ILCS 5/3-616, or to a disabled veteran pursuant to 625 ILCS 5/3-609.
- (2) A restricted handicapped parking area is an area so marked by signs clearly indicating such, posted in public areas at the discretion of the city. The parking space as provided hereunder shall be at least sixteen (16) feet wide, parallel to the cur.
- (c) Regulation. No motor vehicle shall occupy any parking space in the city which is designated and marked for the use of handicapped persons only. Unless such vehicle is operated by a person defined handicapped according to subsection (b) of this section. Parking privileges granted by this section are strictly limited to the person to whom the special registration plates, special decal or device were issued and to qualified operators acting under his express direction while the disabled person is present.
- (d) Enforcement. The police department of the city shall enforce this section through the issuance of citations and the towing of vehicles in violation. It shall be prohibited to park any motor vehicle which is not bearing registration plates or decals issued to a physically handicapped person pursuant to 625 ILCS 5/3-616 OR 625 ILCS 5/11-1302.2 or to a disabled veteran pursuant to 625 ILCS 5/3-609, as evidence that the vehicle is operated by or for a handicapped person or disabled veteran, in any parking place, including any private or public off-street parking facility specifically reserved, by the posting of an official sign, the motor vehicles bearing such registration plates.
- (e) Permits. The city clerk and police department shall be authorized to issue numbered cards (not more than two (2) per applicant) to handicapped persons desiring to use handicapped parking zones in the city. Such cards shall be displayed on the dashboard of the vehicle and visible through the front windshield, or slipped onto the visor.
- (f) Penalty. Any person who violates any provision of this section shall be punished by a fine of up0 to three hundred fifty dollars (\$350.00) per offense to be assessed in accordance with the schedule of fines set forth in section 90-74 of this Code.
- All fines herein shall be subject to chapter 2, article IX, code enforcement, of this Code.
- (g) Signed areas. The following areas are hereby designated as restricted handicapped parking areas by the city council, and appropriate signs shall be posted clearly indicating such areas:

WHEREAS, Section 6(a) of Article VII of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois provides that any municipality which has a population of more than 25,000 is a home rule unit, and the City of Calumet City, Cook County, Illinois ("City"), with a population in excess of 25,000 is, therefore, a home rule unit and, pursuant to the provisions of said Section 6(a) of Article VII, may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs; and

WHEREAS, there is an increasing interest in the business and utilization of event spaces throughout the City; and

WHEREAS, there is also a need to ensure the health and safety of residents and patrons frequenting said event spaces; and

WHEREAS, amendments to the current Code of ordinances are necessary in order to ensure that local event spaces are up to current health and safety codes.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CALUMET CITY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the City hereby incorporates all of the recitals above into this Ordinance as if fully set forth herein.

Section 2. That Article XIX, "BANQUET FACILITIES AND EVENT SPACE" of Chapter 54 of the Calumet City Municipal Code is hereby amended to add the underlined text and/or delete the text as indicated:

## Sec. 54-2347. - License required.

It shall be unlawful to operate a banquet facility or event space without first obtaining a license from the city. In order to obtain and maintain a license, the business must comply with all of the provisions of Sections 38-184, 38-187, 38-188, and 38-407 through 38-413 of Article IV of Chapter 38.

WHEREAS, to foster economic development and a diversity of businesses in the City, the City finds that it is advisable and the best interest of the City's residents to limit the total number of licenses for Tobacco Dealers; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CALUMET CITY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the City hereby incorporates all of the recitals above into this Ordinance as if fully set forth herein.

Section 2. That Division 24 "TOBACCO DEALERS" of Chapter 54 "Licenses and Permits and Miscellaneous Business Regulations" of the Calumet City Municipal Code is hereby amended to add the underlined text and/or delete the text as indicated:

## Sec. 54 -1700. Defined.

For the purpose of this division, a Tobacco Dealer shall be defined as a person or entity, offering for sale tobacco, smoking or vape supplies, or operating a smokeasies, a cigar bar, or cigar

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lounge, whose primary business consists of sales of tobacco, smoking or vape supplies or where such sales constitute fifty (50) percent of sales. Vaping and smoking supplies include, but are not limited to smoking accessories, pipes, vape solutions, vaporizers, hooka supplies, and electric-cigarettes.

#### Sec. 54-1702. - License.

- (a)Required. It shall be unlawful for a Tobacco Dealer to operate engage in the sale at retail of eigarettes, eigars or tobacco in any form without a license. No person shall operate smokeasies or operate a business as a eigar bar, eigar lounge, tobacco shop or smoke shop without obtaining a license. Tobacco shop and smoke shop shall include businesses whose primary business consists of sales of vaping or smoking supplies or where such sales constitute fifty (50) percent of sales. Vaping and smoking supplies include, but is not limited to, smoking accessories, pipes, vape solutions, vaporizers, hooka supplies, and E eigs.
- (b)Application. Applications for licenses required by the provisions of this division shall be made to the city clerk and no such license shall be issued to any person who is not a person of good character or to any corporation that is not represented in the city by a person of good character.
- (c) Fee. The annual fee for the license required by this division shall be one hundred fifty dollars (\$150.00).

# AN ORDINANCE AMENDING DIVISION 4 "BARBERSHOPS AND SALONS" OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF CALUMET CITY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS GOVERNING THE NUMBER OF LICENSES

WHEREAS, Section 6(a) of Article VII of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois provides that any municipality which has a population of more than 25,000 is a home rule unit, and the City of Calumet City, Cook County, Illinois ("City"), with a population in excess of 25,000 is, therefore, a home rule unit and, pursuant to the provisions of said Section 6(a) of Article VII, may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs; and

WHEREAS, the City current licenses all Barbershops and Salons, as defined in Section 54-981 of the Calumet City Municipal Code; and

WHEREAS, to foster economic development and a diversity of businesses in the City, the City finds that it is advisable and the best interest of the City's residents to limit the total number of licenses for Barbershops and Salons; and

WHEREAS, the City currently has 57 licensed Barbershops and Salons; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities of the City of Calumet City, in the interest of the public health, safety and welfare have determined that it is appropriate to amend the Calumet City Municipal Code to limit the total number of business licenses for Barbershops and Salons; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CALUMET CITY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> That the City hereby incorporates all of the recitals above into this Ordinance as if fully set forth herein.

<u>Section 2.</u> That Division 4 "BARBERSHOPS AND SALONS" of Chapter 54 "Licenses and Permits and Miscellaneous Business Regulations" of the Calumet City Municipal Code is hereby amended to add the underlined text and/or delete the text as indicated:

Sec. 54-985. Permitted number of Licenses for Barbershops and Salons.

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The total number of business licenses issued for Barbershops and Salons, as defined in Section 54-981 of the Calumet City Municipal Code, shall not exceed 40. Any person or business entity holding a license for a Barbershop or Salon shall be entitled to maintain that license, even if the total number of licenses exceeds 40. However, should any previously issued license lapse or be revoked, the person or business entity shall not be able to apply for another Barbershop or Salon license until such time as there are less than 40 licenses.

Section 3: Superseder. In the event a conflict exists between the terms of this Ordinance and any other ordinance or resolution of the City, the terms of this Ordinance shall govern. In the event that a conflict exists between the text of any portion of Chapter 90 of the City Code and this Ordinance, the terms of this Ordinance shall govern.

Section 4: Severability. This Ordinance and every provision thereof shall be considered severable and the invalidity of any section clause, paragraph, sentence or provision of this Ordinance will not affect the validity of any other portion of this Ordinance.

Section 5: Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and publication in pamphlet form, in accordance with law, and the provisions of the Calumet City's Municipal Code amended herein shall be reprinted with the changes.

# AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE MUTUAL AID BOX ALARM SYSTEM

WHEREAS, the Mutual Aid Box Alarm System (MABAS) was organized beginning in 1968 in the northwest and western suburbs of Chicago, Illinois to coordinate and automate fire department mutual aid, based roughly on the Chicago Fire Department's box alarm system of predetermined resources assigned to respond to a specific incident or area. Since 1968, MABAS has grown into a multi-state organization to coordinate responses to fires, emergency medical calls, hazardous material, technical rescue and other emergencies and disasters through prearranged mutual aid and dispatch agreements. The system is designed to facilitate all levels of mutual aid from day-to-day automatic aid responses to major incidents and disasters requiring significant deployment of resources. MABAS number Units include the gambit from all-volunteer fire departments to major cities like Chicago, Milwaukee and St. Louis; and

WHEREAS, since the last revision of the master MABAS intergovernmental agreement in about 1988, MABAS has grown exponentially to its current composition of almost 1200 Illinois Units and 2200 total Units in Illinois and several adjoining States; and

WHEREAS, it is the express intent of member Units that the MABAS Agreement be in a form which can be adopted by Units of different States where Units may lawfully enter into

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agreements providing for their mutual aid and protection. Thus, even if the MABAS Agreement does not specifically cite the applicable current legal authority for a particular State and its member Units, the lack of such citation shall not be construed in any manner as san impediment to or prohibition of Units from other States from joining MABAS. It is also the express intent of the member Units that all Units adopt this same Intergovernmental Agreement without modification; and

WHEREAS, the Constitution of the State of Illinois, 1970, Article VII, Section 10, authorizes unites of local government to contract or otherwise associate among themselves, with the State, with other States and their units of local government, and with the United States to obtain and share services and to exercise, combine, or transfer any power or function in any manner not prohibited by law or ordinance; and to further contract or otherwise associate with individuals, associations, and corporations in any manner not prohibited by law or ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the "Intergovernmental Cooperation Act," 5 ILCS 220/1 et seq., provides that any power or powers, privileges or authority exercised or which may be exercised by a unit of local government may be exercised and enjoyed jointly with any other unit of local government including units of local government from another state; and

WHEREAS, Section 5 of the "Intergovernmental Cooperation Act," 5 ILCS 220/5, provides that any one or more public agencies may contract with any one or more public agencies to perform any governmental service, activity or undertaking which any of the public agencies entering into the contract is authorized by law to perform, provided that such contract shall be authorized by the governing body of each party to the contract; and

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WHEREAS, the Mayor and the Council of the City of Calumet City have determined that it is in the best interests of this unit of local government and its residents to enter into a Mutual Aid Box Alarm System to secure to each the benefits of mutual aid in the fire protection, firefighting, rescue, emergency medical services and other activities for the protection of life and property from an emergency or disaster and to provide for communications procedures, training and other necessary functions to further the provision of said protection of life and property from an emergency or disaster.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Calumet City, Cook County, Illinois as follows:

SECTION 1: INCORPORATION OF RECITALS. That the recitals set forth above are incorporated here by reference.

SECTION 2: APPROVAL OF AGREEMENT. That the Mutual Aid Box Alarm System Master Agreement, (Approved by the MABAS Executive Board October 19, 2022) is hereby approved, and the Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to execute the Mutual Aid Box Alarm System Master Agreement, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A and made a part hereof.

SECTION 3: REPEALER. All prior ordinances, resolutions or motions, or parts of ordinances, resolutions, or motions in conflict with any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be, and the same are hereby repealed to the extent of the conflict.

SECTION 4: SEVERABILITY. This Ordinance and every provision thereof shall be considered severable. If any section, paragraph, clause, or provision of this Ordinance is declared by a court of law to be invalid or unconstitutional, the invalidity or unconstitutionality thereof shall

not affect the validity of any other provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 5: EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval in the manner provided by law.
