

**RE: City Council Memorandum
Timing – Traffic Signals on Torrence Avenue & Sibley Blvd.**

Dear Mayor and City Council:

This memo is in response to the December 8, 2016 City Council Meeting (Item 8A-#1), referring to the City Engineer to investigate the timing for the Northbound to Westbound Left Turn Lane from Torrence Avenue to Sibley Blvd. (this intersection is owned and maintained by the Illinois Department of Transportation, IDOT). A call was placed to the IDOT Area Traffic Engineer to follow up and a field investigation of the entire system was conducted on December 9, 2016.

The results of the field study concluded that the system could be Re-Optimized to add several additional seconds to the traffic movement in question. The improvements will be conducted for all peak periods (i.e. AM Peak, Mid-Day & PM Peak Periods). It was also determined that two (2) systems detectors were also damaged during the FY 2012 resurfacing improvement on Torrence Avenue from Sibley Blvd. to Interstate 80 that affects the signal progression from Sibley Blvd. to Interstate 94. IDOT will begin repairs shortly to repair the detector loops and recalibrate the entire closed loop system.

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 90 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE
OF THE CITY OF CALUMET CITY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS**

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Calumet City, Cook County, Illinois, by and through its home rule powers, as follows:

Section 1. That Section 90-317 (Handicapped parking) of Article V [Stopping, Standing and Parking] of Chapter 90 [Traffic and Vehicles] of the Municipal Code of Calumet City, Illinois, is hereby amended by adding the following language to subsection G (Signed areas) to read, as follows:

1701 Memorial Drive

Section 2. The Commissioner of Streets and Alleys is hereby authorized and directed to install the proper signs in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Ordinance.

Section 3. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any other provision of this Ordinance.


Section 4. All ordinances, resolutions, motions or orders in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

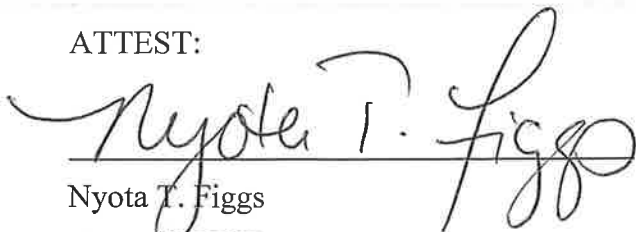

ORDINANCE NO. 16-40

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 54, ARTICLE XIV, SECTION 54-2227,
OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF CALUMET CITY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS
(CRIME-FREE RESIDENTIAL RENTAL LICENSE)**

WHEREAS, the City of Calumet City, Cook County, Illinois (the "City") is a home rule municipality pursuant to Section 6(a), Article VII of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois, and as such may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs (the "*Home Rule Powers*"); and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and the City Council of the City of Calumet City (the "*Corporate Authorities*") may from time to time amend the text of the Municipal Code of Calumet City when it is determined to be in the best interests of the City; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities are charged with the responsibility of overseeing implementation of the terms and provisions of the City's Crime-Free Residential Rental Ordinance in a manner that encourages compliance by all landlords and managers of residential rental housing in the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Calumet City, Cook County, Illinois, by and through its Home Rule Powers, as follows:

SECTION 1: That the above recitals are incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as it fully set forth in their entirety.

SECTION 2: That Chapter 54 ("*Licenses and Permits and Miscellaneous Business Regulations*"), Article XIV ("*Crime-Free Residential Rental License*"), Section 54-2227, ("*Crime-Free Residential Rental License Fee*"), of the Municipal Code of

Calumet City, Illinois, is hereby amended by adding the following as an additional paragraph at the end of this section:

Sec. 54-2227. Crime-Free Residential Rental License Fee.

Any multi-unit residential rental building with three (3) dwelling units or less and which includes one (1) or more dwelling units occupied by the owner or owners of the building will be exempt from payment of the Annual Crime-Free Housing Ordinance rental license fee. This exemption from payment of the annual license fee will not apply if the owner of the building is not in compliance with all of the remaining provisions of Chapter 54, Article XIV of the Municipal Code at the time of application for the initial license or for renewal of the license.

SECTION 3: If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any of the other provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4: All ordinances, resolutions, motions or orders in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

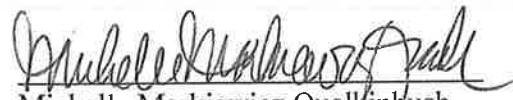

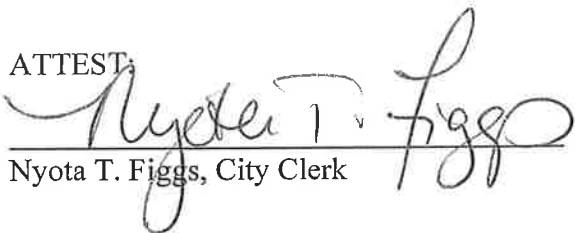

FISCAL YEAR MAY 1, 2016 TO APRIL 30, 2017

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Calumet City, Cook County, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION 1: That the amount of taxes for the 2016 tax levy year extended in the year 2017 for the fiscal year commencing May 1, 2016 and ending April 30, 2017 for the Special Service Area 98-2 to be levied upon all property subject to taxation within the Special Service Area Number 98-2 as established by the City of Calumet City under Ordinance No. 99-16 (legal description attached) is hereby fixed at \$300,000.00 and said sum is hereby accordingly levied upon all property in the Special Service Area 98-2.

SECTION 2: That the sum of \$300,000.00 being taxes to be levied for the fiscal year as specified in Section 1 of the Ordinance shall, when received, be used for the purposes of paying or reimbursing the following items for each of which an appropriation has been made in and by the Appropriation Ordinance passed by the City Council of the City of Calumet City on the 28th day of July, 2016 and published as required by law, as more fully appears on the certificate of publication on said Appropriation Ordinance, all now on file in the office of the City Clerk of the City of Calumet City.

SECTION 3: That the total amount of three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000.00) ascertained as aforesaid be, and the same is hereby levied and assessed on all property subject to taxation within the Special Service Area 98-2 according to the value of said property as the same is assessed and equalized for State and County purposes for the current year.

SECTION 4: This Levy Ordinance is adopted pursuant to the procedure set forth in the Illinois Municipal Code.

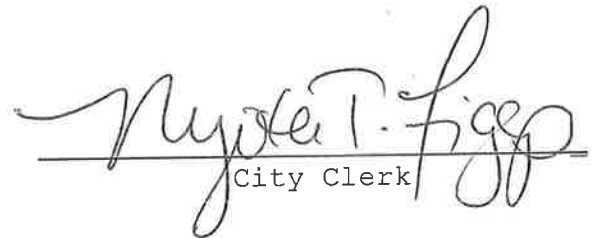

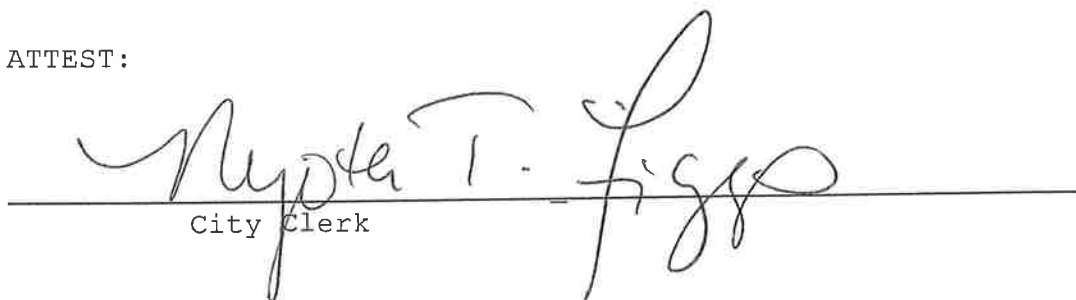

CALUMET CITY FOR THE 2016 TAX LEVY YEAR EXTENDED
IN THE YEAR 2017 FOR THE
FISCAL YEAR MAY 1, 2016 TO APRIL 30, 2017**

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Calumet City, Cook County, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION 1: That the amount of taxes for the fiscal year commencing May 1, 2016 and ending April 30, 2017, for all corporate purposes:

For General Corporate Fund
For Illinois Municipal Retirement Fund
For Library Fund
For Firefighters' Pension Fund
For Policemen's Pension Fund

to be levied upon all property subject to taxation within the City of Calumet City, including railroads, as the same is assessed and equalized for State and County purposes for said year, be and the same is hereby fixed at \$23,962,210 and said sum is hereby accordingly levied upon all property in said City to taxation as aforesaid.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF CALUMET CITY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, APPROVING AN ECONOMIC INCENTIVE AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN THE CITY OF CALUMET CITY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS AND MEATS BY LINZ, INC.

WHEREAS, the City of Calumet City, Cook County, Illinois (the "City") is a duly organized and validly existing home-rule municipality created in accordance with the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970 and the laws of the State; and,

WHEREAS, the City has adopted as one of its economic development goals the expansion and stabilization of the small business community in Calumet City in order to stabilize its tax base, expand employment opportunities and eradicate existing blight; and,

WHEREAS, in order to implement its goals of economic development, expansion of business and eradication of blight, the City adopted tax increment financing under the Tax Increment Allocation Redevelopment Act of the State of Illinois, 65 ILCS 5/11-74.4-1 *et seq.*, as from time to time amended (the "*Act*"), whereby assistance may be rendered to induce businesses to locate in the City as a part of a total redevelopment project and redevelopment plan for a designated area (the "*Project Area*"); and,

WHEREAS, Meats by Linz, Inc. of 414 State Street, Calumet City, Illinois (the "*Developer*"), an Illinois corporation currently engages in the processing, sales and delivery of various meat products in the City and has determined that expansion of its business is necessary for the future growth of its operation; and,

WHEREAS, In 2003, the Developer located its meat processing plant and office facilities in the Calumet City Project Area located at 414 State Street between Ingraham and Douglas Avenues (the "*Existing Facility*") and has determined that substantial expansion of its facility (the "*Project*") is now warranted but only if the City shall financially assist with the cost of the Project.

The Existing Facility is owned by B & F Holdings LLC (the "Owner"), a limited liability company whose members are the same as the owners of the Developer. The Developer and Owner have advised the City that without substantial assistance, as authorized by the Act, the Developer and Owner are not willing to undertake this expansion which would increase the tax base of the City and provide additional job opportunities for its residents; and,

WHEREAS, the City has reviewed the entire proposal of the Developer and Owner and has determined that it is in the best interest of the City to provide assistance to the Developer and Owner in order to induce the expansion of its facility and operations by conveying the vacant property owned by the City and located to the west of the Existing Facility and sell the City's property at 185 Plummer for additional business expansion, subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Economic Incentive Agreement Providing For Expansion of Linz Meats attached hereto and made a part hereof.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Calumet City, Cook County, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1. That the Economic Incentive Agreement Providing for the Expansion of Linz Meats, attached hereto and made a part hereof, is hereby approved and the Mayor and City Clerk are hereby authorized to execute and deliver and undertake any and all actions as may be required to implement its terms.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and approval, as provided by law.

WHEREAS, the City, through its Mayor and City Council, would consider taking action that is necessary to raise the minimum wage; and

SECTION 2: The City Clerk shall certify the above advisory proposition to the Cook County Clerk.

SECTION 3: If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any of the other provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4: All Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

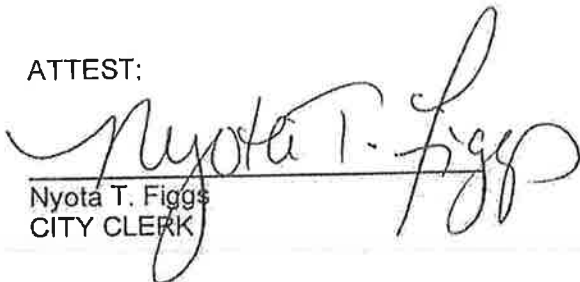

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF CALUMET CITY, COOK COUNTY,
ILLINOIS APPROVING A REDEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT BY AND
BETWEEN THE CITY OF CALUMET CITY AND HB TAYLOR, CO.**

WHEREAS, the City of Calumet City, Cook County, Illinois (the "*City*") is a home rule municipality pursuant to Section 6(a), Article VII of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois, and as such may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs (the "*Home Rule Powers*"); and

WHEREAS, the City has attempted various strategies to spur redevelopment of property within its jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, HB Taylor, Co. (the "*Developer*"), has proposed to acquire certain property located at 100 Riverside Drive in order to develop the property for its industrial business; and

WHEREAS, it is desirable and in the best interest of the citizens for the City to authorize and approve the proposed agreement for redevelopment.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Calumet City, Cook County, Illinois, by and through its Home Rule Powers, as follows:

Section 1. That the above recitals are found to be true and correct and are hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as if fully set forth in their entirety.

Section 2. The Redevelopment Agreement by and between the City of Calumet City, and HB Taylor, Co. to induce the redevelopment of 100 Riverside Drive (the "*Agreement*"), a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit A, is hereby approved substantially in the form presented to this City Council, with any and all such necessary changes as may be

approved by the Mayor.

Section 3. The Mayor and City Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver said Agreement and any and all other documents necessary to implement the provisions, terms and conditions thereof, as therein described.

Section 4. The Officers and Officials of the City are hereby authorized to undertake actions on the part of the City as contained in said Agreement to complete satisfaction of any provision, term and condition thereof, as stated therein.

Section 5. The City Treasurer is hereby authorized to undertake any and all such payments necessary in order to comply with the terms specified with the Agreement.

Section 6. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any other provision of this Ordinance.

Section 7. All ordinances, resolutions, motions or orders in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.


Section 8. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

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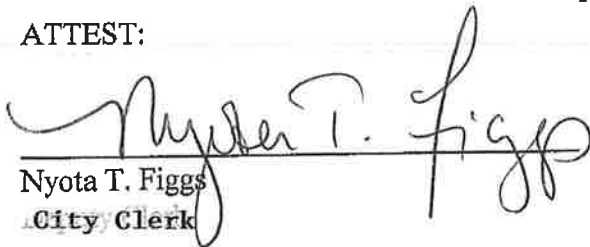

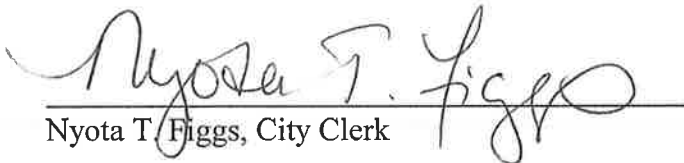
