ORDINANCE NO.: 15-7

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 90 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF CALUMET CITY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Calumet City, Cook County, Illinois, by and through its home rule powers, as follows:

Section 1. That Section 90-317 (Handicapped parking) of Article V [Stopping, Standing and Parking] of Chapter 90 [Traffic and Vehicles] of the Municipal Code of Calumet City, Illinois, is hereby amended by adding the following language to subsection G (Signed areas) to read, as follows:

532 Exchange Avenue

Section 2. The Commissioner of Streets and Alleys is hereby authorized and directed to install the proper signs in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Ordinance.

Section 3. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any other provision of this Ordinance.

Section 4. All ordinances, resolutions, motions or orders in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

Ordinance No. 15-8

AN ORDINANCE DESIGNATING THE CITY OF CALUMET CITY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, SIBLEY/EAST END AVENUE BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT AND IMPOSING A RETAILERS' OCCUPATION TAX, SERVICE OCCUPATION TAX, AND HOTEL OPERATORS' OCCUPATION TAX THEREIN

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Calumet City, Cook County, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1. Authority. The City of Calumet City, Cook County, Illinois (the "City") is authorized, pursuant to the provisions of the Business District Development and Redevelopment Law, 65 ILCS 5/11-74.3-1, et seq. (the "Act"), to designate business districts to promote development or redevelopment in the City and to impose a retailers' occupation tax, a service occupation tax, and a hotel operators' occupation tax therein and to issue bonds to provide for the payment of business district project costs.

Section 2. Findings.

- (a) The designation of the area hereinafter described as the Sibley/East End Avenue Business Development District (the "Business District") was considered at a public hearing held on March 12, 2015 (the "Public Hearing"). The Public Hearing was held pursuant to notices duly published twice in a newspaper of general circulation within the City not more than thirty (30) nor less than ten (10) days prior to the Public Hearing. Said notices conform in all respects to the requirements of the Act.
- (b) At the Public Hearing, all interested persons were given an opportunity to be heard on the question of the designation of the Business District, the approval of a business district development and redevelopment plan for the Business District; the imposition of a retailers' occupation tax, a service occupation tax, and a hotel operators' occupation tax in the Business District for the planning and for the payment of business district project costs as set forth in such plan; and the issuance of obligations by the City to provide for the payment of business district project costs secured by the business district tax allocation fund established hereinafter pursuant to the Act.
- (c) After considering the data as presented to the Mayor and City Council of the City (the "Corporate Authorities") at the Public Hearing, the Corporate Authorities find that it is in the best interests of the City and of the residents and property owners within the Business District that the Business District be designated.
- (d) The Business District is contiguous and includes only parcels of real property directly and substantially benefited by the proposed business district development plan as required by the Act.
- (e) The Business District conforms to the comprehensive plan of the City which was adopted in 2014.

- (f) The Business District is a blighted area by reason of deterioration of site improvements, thereby hindering the growth and development in the area, all as set forth in the business district plan prepared by Kathleen Field Orr & Associates of Chicago, Illinois. Due to such conditions, the Business District constitutes an economic liability upon the City and its residents.
- (g) The blighting factors as stated above are widely present throughout the Business District and therefore the Business District on the whole has not been subject to growth and development through investment by private enterprise and would not reasonably be anticipated to be developed or redeveloped without the adoption of the business district plan.
- (h) It is in the best interests of the City that the Business District be designated in order to provide for the financing of the Business District project costs as set forth in the Business District Plan hereinafter described; that a retailers' occupation tax, a service occupation tax, and a hotel operators' occupation tax be imposed in the Business District for the planning, execution, and implementation of the Business District Plan and for the payment of Business District Project costs as set forth in the Business District Plan; and, that obligations, if approved by the City, be issued to provide for the payment of Business District project costs secured by the Sibley/East End Avenue Business Development District Tax Allocation Fund established pursuant to the Act and hereinafter described.
- Section 3. Designation of the City of Calumet City, Sibley/East End Avenue Business Development District. The "City of Calumet City, Illinois, Sibley/East End Avenue Business Development District" is hereby designated for a period of twenty three (23) years from the date of adoption of this Ordinance and shall consist of the contiguous territory legally described in the attached Exhibit A and outlined on a map in the attached Exhibit B, which exhibits are by this reference incorporated herein and made a part hereof.
- Section 4. Approval of the City of Calumet City, Cook County, Illinois, Sibley/East End Avenue Business Development District Development Plan. A plan for the development and redevelopment of the Business District (the "Business District Plan"), attached hereto as Exhibit C, and by this reference incorporated herein and made a part hereof, was presented to the Corporate Authorities and considered at the Public Hearing. The Business District Plan is found to conform to the requirements of the Act and to promote the public interest. The Business District Plan is hereby approved.
- Section 5. Imposition of Retailers' Occupation Tax, Creation of Sibley/East End Avenue Business Development District Tax Allocation Fund. Pursuant to the Act, a tax is hereby imposed upon all persons engaged in the business of selling tangible personal property, other than an item of tangible personal property titled or registered with an agency of this State's government, at retail within the boundaries of the Business District at the rate of one percent (1%) of the gross receipts from such sales made in the course of such business while this Ordinance is in effect. Such tax shall not be applicable to the sale of food for human consumption that is to be consumed off the premises where it is sold (other than alcoholic beverages, soft drinks, and food that has been prepared for immediate consumption), prescription and nonprescription medicines, drugs, medical appliances, modifications to a motor vehicle for

the purpose of rendering it usable by a disabled person, and insulin, urine testing materials, syringes, and needles used by diabetics, for human use. All businesses in the Business District affected by this tax are listed on *Exhibit D*, attached hereto and incorporated herein. The proceeds of this tax shall be used for the planning, execution and implementation of the Business District Plan, the payment of Business District project costs as set forth in the Business District Plan and the payment of obligations of the City issued to provide for the payment of Business District project costs. The proceeds of such tax shall be deposited into a special fund of the City which is hereby created and designated the "Sibley/East End Avenue Business Development District Tax Allocation Fund." The tax imposed under this Section and all civil penalties that may be assessed as an incident thereto shall be collected and enforced by the Illinois Department of Revenue. The Department of Revenue shall have full power to administer and enforce the provisions of this Section.

Imposition of Service Occupation Tax. Pursuant to the Act, a tax is hereby Section 6. imposed upon all persons engaged within the boundaries of the Business District in the business of making sales of service, at the rate of one percent (1%) of the selling price of all tangible personal property transferred within the Business District by such servicemen either in the form of tangible personal property or in the form of real estate as an incident to a sale of service. Such tax may not be imposed on the sale of food for human consumption that is to be consumed off the premises where it is sold (other than alcoholic beverages, soft drinks, and food that has been prepared for immediate consumption), prescription and nonprescription medicines, drugs, medical appliances, modifications to a motor vehicle for the purpose of rendering it usable by a disabled person, and insulin, urine testing materials, syringes, and needles used by diabetics, for human use. All businesses in the Business District affected by this tax are listed on Exhibit D. The proceeds of this tax shall be used for the planning, execution and implementation of the Business District Plan, the payment of Business District project costs as set forth in the Business District Plan and the payment of obligations of the City issued to provide for the payment of Business District project costs. The proceeds of such tax shall be deposited into the "Sibley/East End Avenue Business Development District Tax Allocation Fund." The tax imposed under this Section and all civil penalties that may be assessed as an incident thereto shall be collected and enforced by the Illinois Department of Revenue. The Department of Revenue shall have full power to administer and enforce the provisions of this Section.

Section 7. Imposition of Hotel Operators' Occupation Tax. Pursuant to the Act, an occupation tax is hereby imposed upon all persons engaged within the boundaries of the Business District in the business of renting, leasing, or letting rooms in a hotel at a rate of one percent (1%) of the gross rental receipts from the renting, leasing, or letting of hotel rooms within the Business District, excluding from gross rental receipts the proceeds of renting, leasing or letting to permanent residents of a hotel. The proceeds of this tax shall be used for the planning, execution and implementation of the Business District Plan, the payment of Business District project costs as set forth in the Business District Plan and the payment of obligations of the City issued to provide for the payment of Business District project costs. The proceeds of such tax shall be deposited into the "Sibley/East End Avenue Business Development District Tax Allocation Fund." The tax imposed under this Section and all civil penalties that may be assessed as an incident thereto shall be collected and enforced by the City. The City shall have full power to administer and enforce the provisions of this Section.

- Section 8. Filing. A certified copy of this Ordinance, together with a description of the boundaries of the Business District, shall be filed with the Department of Revenue immediately following its passage and shall be considered filed on or before April 1, 2015, in accordance with Section 1 of this Ordinance.
- Section 9. Supercede Conflicting Ordinance. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 10. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval in the manner provided by law, the Illinois Department of Revenue and City shall proceed to administer and enforce Sections 5 and 6 of this Ordinance on the first day of July next following the adoption and filing of this Ordinance with the Illinois Department of Revenue, and the City shall proceed to administer and enforce Section 7 of this Ordinance upon passage and approval of this Ordinance.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF CALUMET CITY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING A COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM APPLICATION FOR PROGRAM YEAR 2015

WHEREAS, the City of Calumet City, Cook County, Illinois (the "City") is a home rule municipality pursuant to Section 6(a), Article VII of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois, and as such may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs (the "Home Rule Powers").

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Calumet City, Cook County, Illinois, by and through its Home Rules Powers, as follows:

Section 1. That the above recital is found to be true and correct and is hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as if fully set forth in its entirety.

Section 2. That a request is hereby made to the County of Cook, Illinois for Community Development Block Grant (the "CDBG") funds for Program Year 2015 in the amount of \$398,000.00 for the following:

Project:

Drive, segment length 1,350 feet (0.26 miles); Hoxie Avenue from Sibley Boulevard to Stewart Avenue, segment length 1,340 feet (0.25 miles); Luella Avenue from State Street to Harding Avenue, segment length 1,970 feet (0.37 miles); Wilson Avenue from Merrill Avenue to Paxton Avenue, segment length 390 feet (0.07 miles); Warren Avenue from State Line Road to Wentworth Avenue, segment length 1,230 feet (0.23 miles); 162nd Street from Burnham Avenue to Price Avenue, segment length 666 feet (0.13 miles); Mackinaw Avenue from 161st Street to 163rd Street, segment length 1,375 feet (0.26 miles). The scope of work will consist of removing 2 ½ inches of existing hot-mix asphalt and replacing it with 2 ½ inches of new hot-mix asphalt. It will also include pavement patching, structure adjustments and curb and gutter adjustments, as needed, to comply with Americans with Disability Act requirements, along with pavement striping.

Section 3. That the Mayor, City Clerk and Community Development Director are hereby authorized to sign such application and various forms contained therein, make all required submissions, and do all things necessary to make application for the funds requested in this Resolution, a copy of which application is on file with the City.

Section 4. That the Mayor is hereby authorized to certify that matching funds which have been identified as supporting its project as set out within its application will be made available upon the approval of the project by the County of Cook, Illinois or the prorated share thereof.

Section 5. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Resolution shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any other provision of this Resolution.

Section 6. All ordinances, resolutions, motions or orders in conflict with this Resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 7. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect upon its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.
