CITY COUNCIL REPORTS

Sibley Boulevard

Mayor Michelle Markiewicz Qualkinbush: "City Engineer Roberts, I know you wanted to report about the Sibley Boulevard Resurfacing. I think sometime ago we resurfaced Sibley Boulevard from Torrence Avenue east.

I know a lot of residents were concerned why we didn't go Torrence Avenue west and that is because it is IDOT maintained road and we are really happy to announce that IDOT is going to resurface that and I believe it will be starting in a couple of months. The city engineer will give the particulars."

City Engineer Roberts: "Good evening Madam Mayor and City Council. I have two items as the Mayor mentioned. Sibley Boulevard Illinois Route 83 will be resurfaced and will be a total of 5.5 miles of resurfacing through several communities specifically in Calumet City from I-94 to Torrence Avenue.

The project is scheduled to start in mid-April of this year and to be completed by the end of August, 2015. We have also sent a request to IDOT to petition them for pedestrian and bicycle combinations as part of IDOT's complete street program.

The second item as of March 24, 2015, IDOT, State Police and the Illinois Tollway will join by the Industry Partners to kickoff National Work Zone Awareness Week.

The reminder to all Illinois Motorists expect the unexpected driving through work zones to signal to start of construction season and call attention to dangers to driving in work zones.

Governor Bruce Rauner has signed a Proclamation designating this week as Work Zone Safety Week in Illinois. The theme for this year is National Work Zone Awareness Week Expect the Unexpected.

Whenever motorists are traveling through work zones they need to be aware of sudden lane closures and shifts, the presence of construction equipment, change in traffic patterns and speeds as well as a host of other factors that can make work zones potentially a dangerous place.

More than 4,300 motor vehicle crashes occurred in Illinois work zones every year. Provisional data shows that 29 people included three workers were killed in Illinois Work Zone crashes in 2014.

Speed and inattentiveness are major contributors to work zone crashes. Workers are not only the ones at risk either. Stats show that approximately 90 percent work zone fatalities are motorists.

Lastly in recent years Illinois has adopted distractive driving laws that prohibit the use of all handheld electronic devices while driving at all times, work zones included.

The uses of electronic communication devices or any other electronic devices to text, email, compose, read or send electronic messages or access the internet sites while driving a motor vehicle is also prohibited.

The following funds are hereby abolished and terminated effective immediately:





RESOLUTION NUMBER 15-10

**A RESOLUTION APPROVING A CLASS 6B (SER) REAL ESTATE TAX
ASSESSMENT CLASSIFICATION FOR THE PROPERTY LOCATED AT 14200 AND
14216 YATES WITHIN THE CITY OF CALUMET CITY, THORNTON TOWNSHIP,
COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS
(PLASTICS COLOR CORPORATION)**

WHEREAS, the City of Calumet City, Cook County, Illinois (the “*City*”) is a home rule municipality pursuant to Section 6(a), Article VII of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois, and as such may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs (the “*Home Rule Powers*”); and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Commissioners of the County of Cook have enacted an ordinance known as the Cook County Real Property Assessment Classification Ordinance, as amended from time to time (the “*Classification Ordinance*”), which allows for various real estate tax assessment classifications as an incentive to encourage industrial and commercial growth within the County of Cook in order to create job opportunities and expand the tax base; and

WHEREAS, Cook County has amended the Classification Ordinance to establish a Class 6B SER Sustainable Emergency Relief Tax Incentive classification which provides the applicant a reduction in the assessment level for industrial enterprises demonstrating economic hardship; and

WHEREAS, an owner of property within the corporate boundaries of the City may request that the Mayor and City Council of the City of Calumet City (the “*Corporate Authorities*”) approve a Cook County Class 6B SER Real Estate Tax Assessment Classification (the “*Class 6B SER Classification*”) for said property; and

WHEREAS, the adoption of a resolution by the Corporate Authorities is required and must be filed by the requestor along with an application for said incentive with the County of Cook in order for the property to be eligible for a Class 6B SER Classification; and

WHEREAS, Plastics Color Corporation (the "*Applicant*"), is the owner of certain parcels of property within the City that are commonly known as 14200 Yates and 14216 Yates, Calumet City, Illinois and identified by permanent index numbers (PINs) 29-01-400-023-0000 and 29-01-400-018-0000, which are legally described on Exhibit A, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof (the "*Property*"); and

WHEREAS, the Applicant is seeking the Class 6B SER Classification in order to alleviate the financial constraints they are experiencing in light of the spending needed to maintain the aging structure on the Property, such as the need for tuck pointing as well as the need to upgrade the parking lot and enhance the water intake infrastructure in order to aid in Applicant's production; and

WHEREAS, the Applicant is also proposing to invest \$3,000,000 to \$7,000,000 into the Property as well as increasing the number of staff, the viability of such redevelopment being dependent on the eligibility of the Property for a Class 6B SER Classification; and

WHEREAS, the City finds that special circumstances such as the hindrance of access to the Property by the extended delays of rail cars by the railroad companies which block any and all access to the Property and the ever increasing costs of maintenance, operation, payroll and property taxes make it increasingly difficult to remain financially solvent and which justify finding that the Property is qualified for the Class 6B SER Classification; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities find that the sustainment of the industrial business on the Property will only occur if the Class 6B SER Classification is authorized so as to continue its operations at its current location and maintain its staff and without such designation the Applicant's business would not be economically viable causing the Property to be in imminent risk of becoming vacant and unused; and

WHEREAS, to help alleviate financial hardship, to promote industrial growth, to create new employment opportunities within the City and to expand and further diversify the tax base of the City, the Corporate Authorities declare that it is necessary and in the best interests of the City to approve the Class 6B SER Classification for the Property, pursuant to the Classification Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities hereby request that the President and Cook County Board of Commissioners of the County of Cook concur with the findings of special circumstances by the City and authorize the Class 6B SER Classification for the Property.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Calumet City, Cook County, Illinois, by and through its Home Rule Powers, as follows:

Section 1. That the above recitals and legislative findings are found to be true and correct and are hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as if fully set forth in their entirety.

Section 2. The Corporate Authorities find that the financial hardship and special circumstances of the Applicant and Property necessitate the Class 6B SER Classification and without it the Property will become vacant and underutilized causing the exasperation of blighted factors within the area surrounding the Property.

Section 3. The Corporate Authorities find that the Class 6B SER Classification incentive program established by the County of Cook is necessary for the maintenance and redevelopment herein contemplated to occur on the Property, which is the subject of this Resolution.

Section 4. The Corporate Authorities support and consent to the filing of a Class 6B SER Tax Assessment Incentive Eligibility Application by the Applicant for the Property, which is herein legally described.

Section 5. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Resolution shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any other provision of this Resolution.

Section 6. All ordinances, resolutions, motions or orders in conflict with this Resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 7. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect upon its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.



**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF CALUMET CITY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS
OPPOSING CUTS BY THE STATE OF ILLINOIS TO THE MUNICIPAL SHARE OF
INCOME TAXES**

WHEREAS, the City of Calumet City, Cook County, Illinois (the "*City*") is a home rule municipality pursuant to Section 6(a), Article VII of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois, and as such may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs (the "*Home Rule Powers*").

WHEREAS, the City of Calumet City recognizes the State of Illinois is dealing with a significant and difficult budgetary crisis; and

WHEREAS, the City of Calumet City also appreciates that the State of Illinois must implement financially sound measures to address serious pending budget issues in order to get its financial affairs in order; and

WHEREAS, the City of Calumet City considers it to be equally important for the State of Illinois to also recognize that municipalities are struggling to balance their budgets and have limited sources of revenue with which to meet and pay for the valuable and necessary services they provide for their residents and citizens on a daily basis; and

WHEREAS, the City of Calumet City depends on the portion of the income tax it receives from the State to provide over ten percent (10%) of the revenue it uses to pay for municipal services and operations; and

WHEREAS, the City of Calumet City has done its level best to exercise good stewardship to keep its financial affairs in order; and

WHEREAS, the City of Calumet City cannot afford to suffer a loss of any portion of the State Income Tax it presently receives much less the approximate \$1.8 million the City will lose if the proposed cuts to its portion of the income tax are implemented; and

WHEREAS, the City of Calumet City has already made the tough decisions required to enable it to operate efficiently and effectively; and

WHEREAS, any reduction to the amount of income tax distributed by the State will cause a significant financial hardship to the City and its residents.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Calumet City, Cook County, Illinois, by and through its Home Rules Powers, as follows:

Section 1. That the above recitals are found to be true and correct and are hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as if fully set forth in their entirety.

Section 2. The Mayor and City Council of the City of Calumet City oppose as unnecessary and unrealistic the cuts to the municipal share of income taxes that have been proposed against local governments because they will result in significant financial distress to the City and will eliminate over \$1,800,000.00 necessary to pay for critical local services and state mandated expenses.

Section 3. The Mayor and City Council strongly encourage the Governor of the State of Illinois and the elected members of the General Assembly to address the State's fiscal crisis without imposing further cuts to funds required by municipalities to provide much needed and critical services to their residents.

Section 4. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Resolution shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any other provision of this Resolution.

Section 5. All ordinances, resolutions, motions or orders in conflict with this Resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 7. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect upon its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.





**ORDINANCE ABATING THE TAXES HERETO LEVIED FOR
THE YEAR 2014 TO PAY THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST
ON GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS, SERIES 1999,
OF THE CITY OF CALUMET CITY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS**

SECTION 3: This Ordinance shall supersede all ordinances, resolutions or other proceedings heretofore taken in conflict with the terms hereof, and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval.



4. Adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and/or other necessary facilities for the Special Use have been or are being provided at the Property;

5. Adequate measures have been or will be taken to provide ingress and egress for the Special Use and shall be designed so as to minimize traffic congestion on the public streets;
6. The Special Use shall in all other respects conform to the applicable regulations of the B-2 Service Commercial District.


