RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF CALUMET CITY FOR COMPLIANCE WITH THE ILLINOIS TRUTH IN TAXATION ACT FOR THE 2015 TAX LEVY COLLECTED IN 2016 RELATING TO THE CORPORATE FUND, THE LIBRARY FUND, THE IMRF PENSION FUND, THE POLICE AND FIRE PENSION FUNDS AND THE DEBT SERVICE FUNDS.

WHEREAS, Section 35 ILCS 200/18-60 provides that the City Council of the City of Calumet City, Cook County, Illinois shall determine the amounts of money, exclusive of election costs, estimated to be necessary to be raised by taxation for the tax year 2015 collected in 2016 upon the taxable property of the City of Calumet City; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to 35 ILCS 200/18-60, the City Council of the City of Calumet City on July 9, 2015 approved and authorized the public display of a City of Calumet City Corporate Fund, a City of Calumet City Library Fund, a City of Calumet City IMRF Pension Fund, and a City of Calumet City Police and Fire Pension Funds Budget prepared in tentative form for said City for the fiscal year beginning May 1, 2015 and ending April 30, 2016; and

WHEREAS, the budgets for said City of Calumet City Corporate Fund, City of Calumet City Library Fund, City of Calumet City IMRF Pension Fund, and City of Calumet City Police and Fire Pension Funds (hereinafter referred to as the Corporate & Special Purpose Funds) were adopted by the City Council of the City of Calumet City at a legal meeting held on the 30th day of July, 2015; and

WHEREAS, the City of Calumet City has Debt Service Funds created for the payment of outstanding general obligation bonds and notes; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with said budgets and general obligation bond and note ordinances, the following amounts of money, in the aggregate, are estimated to be necessary to be raised by taxation for the 2015 tax year upon the taxable property of the City of Calumet City;

WHEREAS, the total amount of taxes extended for the 2014 tax year for the Corporate and Special Purposes Funds was \$23,958,895, the total amount of taxes extended for the 2014 tax year for the Debt Service Funds was \$4,987,310, and the total amount extended for the 2014 tax year for all the Funds was \$28,946,205; and

WHEREAS, it appears that by virtue of the foregoing amounts of money necessary to be raised by taxation that the 2015 tax levy for the City of Calumet City's Corporate and Special Purpose Funds is 100.00% to the amounts extended for 2014, that the 2015 tax levy for the City of Calumet City's Debt Service Funds is 91.44% to the amount extended for 2014, and that the 2015 tax levy for the City of Calumet City for all levied Funds is 98.53% to the amounts extended for 2014; and

NOW THEREFORE BY IT RESOLVED by the City of Calumet City Council of the City of Calumet City that the following amounts of money, in the aggregate, are hereby determined to be necessary to be raised for the 2015 tax levy upon the taxable property of the City of Calumet City:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 90 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF CALUMET CITY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS

Section 1. That Section 90-317 (Handicapped parking) of Article V [Stopping, Standing and Parking] of Chapter 90 [Traffic and Vehicles] of the Municipal Code of Calumet City, Illinois, is hereby amended by deleting the following language in subsection G (Signed areas), as follows:

1513 Kenilworth

- **Section 2.** The Commissioner of Streets and Alleys is hereby authorized and directed to remove such signs in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Ordinance.
- **Section 3**. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any other provision of this Ordinance.
 - **Section 4.** All ordinances, resolutions, motions or orders in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.
 - **Section 5.** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

Alderman Schneider: "I have a question on page 2 of the bill listing, half way down there are two different items to Global Charter Services for senior buses on 12/8/15 one in the amount of \$2,200.00 and \$3,300.00.

Since these are over \$5,000.00 follow the protocol of the invoicing process."

Mayor Michelle Markiewicz Qualkinbush: "This is the way it was approved last year by the city council. If you wish to have it done that way, there are separate buses. I think there is one for the Bernadine Manor, Victory Center and Garden House for the senior party and we don't have the numbers yet.

We just need general approvals to secure the buses to know the numbers. So those numbers will change."

Alderman Schneider: "So we are spending over \$5,000.00 on buses."

Mayor Michelle Markiewicz Qualkinbush: "We did last year."

Alderman Schneider; "I know Mayor, but we have had 100 of people come to this council chambers complaining about the inability for them to pay their waterbills and we continuously say that we have to raise it, but then we still have frivolous expenses like this.

Mayor Michelle Markiewicz Qualkinbush: "Alderman, I tend to disagree with you."

Alderman Schneider: "We have \$2,200 for food, \$100.00 deposit and \$440.00 and tip. Christmas parties are great but."

Mayor Michelle Markiewicz Qualkinbush: "However, if you do not wish to have parties for the senior facilities then make that motion Alderman."

Alderman Schneider: "It just sneaks in, like free pumpkins and pumpkin patch and at the same time people can't afford their water bills."

Alderman Jones; "I will second the motion."

Mayor Michelle Markiewicz Qualkinbush: "Make the motion alderman. I would like the motion made do you wish the city not pay for the senior Christmas parties."

Alderman Schneider: "I wish to have a discussion about and not just here it is on the bill listing."

Alderman Jones: "I stated last year this should come out of campaign funds. The city shouldn't be paying for this."

Mayor Michelle Markiewicz Qualkinbush: "Excuse me alderman, but it has been like that for long before I sat in this chair."

Alderman Jones: "No we did city parties Mayor, we never did senior parties that cost \$20,000.00."

Mayor Michelle Markiewicz Qualkinbush: "It was done by the Mayor that sat in this chair before me and it has absolutely been done like that since Mayor Bob and that is about 25 to 30 years ago."

Alderman Jones: "Well none of them are here and we are talking about you doing this and doing it for seniors."

Mayor Michelle Markiewicz Qualkinbush: "Are you suggesting that I not have senior parties, but previous Mayors did?"

Alderman Jones; "Mayor, what suggesting is that we are going to do this it is going to cost \$20,000 last year. To my understanding the city had \$17,000.00 when we approved the budget, correct City Treasurer, whatever the amount was.

Now we are spending this on a senior party when we don't need to do that. Use your campaign money to pay for that."
