# A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF CALUMET CITY, COOK COUNTY ILLINOIS SUPPORTING THE RENEWAL OF A CLASS 8 REAL ESTATE TAX ASSESSMENT CLASSIFICATION FOR 16000 PAXTON DRIVE (TYLER PROPERTY GROUP LLC)

WHEREAS, the City of Calumet City, Cook County, Illinois (the "City") is a home rule municipality pursuant to Section 6(a), Article VII of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois, and as such may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs (the "Home Rule Powers"); and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Commissioners of the County of Cook have enacted an ordinance known as the Cook County Real Property Assessment Classification Ordinance, as amended from time to time (the "Classification Ordinance"), which provides for a tax assessment incentive classification designed to encourage development throughout Cook County by offering a real estate tax incentive for the development of new facilities, the rehabilitation of existing structures and the utilization of abandoned buildings in order to create employment opportunities and expand the tax base; and

WHEREAS, Tyler Property Group LLC (the "Owner") owns a certain parcel of property within the City commonly known as 16000 Paxton Avenue, Calumet City, Illinois, identified by a certain permanent index number (PIN) 29-24-100-039-0000 and hereinafter legally described on Exhibit A, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof (the "Property"); and

WHEREAS, Owner has requested that the Mayor and City Council of the City of Calumet City (the "Corporate Authorities") support and consent to the renewal of its Cook County Class 8 Real Estate Tax Assessment Classification for the Property, as said term is

defined in the Classification Ordinance (the "Class 8 Tax Assessment Classification"), and as previously authorized by the Corporate Authorities on April 28, 2005 by Resolution No. 05-20, a copy of said authorizing document is attached hereto and made a part hereof, as Exhibit B; and

WHEREAS, the adoption of a resolution by the Corporate Authorities is required and must be filed by Owner with its renewal application with the County of Cook in order for the Property to maintain its Class 8 Tax Assessment Classification; and

WHEREAS, Owner is an important entity in the City operating a strip mall containing two (2) stores and whose economic viability is dependent on the continued Class 8 Tax Assessment Classification; and

WHEREAS, to ensure the ongoing viability of the facility, the continuation of numerous employment positions in the City and to safeguard the tax base of the City, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is necessary and in the best interests of the City to approve the renewal of the Class 8 Real Estate Tax Assessment Classification for the Property.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Calumet City, Cook County, Illinois, by and through its Home Rule Powers, as follows:

**Section 1**. That the above recitals and legislative findings are found to be true and correct and are hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as if fully set forth in their entirety.

Section 2. The Corporate Authorities find that the continuing economic viability of the Property is necessary and appropriate for the community and that without a Class 8 Tax Assessment Classification the Property would be underutilized and cause blight in the area surrounding the Property.

Section 3. The Corporate Authorities find that the Class 8 Tax Assessment Classification

incentive program established by the County of Cook is necessary for the ongoing commercial use and habitability of the Property, which is the subject of this Resolution.

**Section 4**. The Corporate Authorities support and consent to the filing of a Class 8 Tax Incentive Eligibility Renewal Application by the Applicant and Owner of the Property, which is legally described on Exhibit A.

**Section 5**. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Resolution shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any other provision of this Resolution.

**Section 6**. All ordinances, resolutions, motions or orders in conflict with this Resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

**Section 7**. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect upon its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

#### **ORDINANCE NUMBER 17-23**

# AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 54 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF CALUMET CITY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS WITH REGARD TO CONFLICTS WITH CERTAIN HOME RULE COUNTY ORDINANCES ("LICENSE AND PERMITS AND MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS REGULATIONS")

WHEREAS, the City of Calumet City, Cook County, Illinois (the "Village") is a home rule municipality pursuant to Section 6(a), Article VII of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois, and as such may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs; and

WHEREAS, on October 5, 2016, the Cook County Board of Commissioners adopted an ordinance that requires employers in Cook County to provide a minimum number of paid sick days to employees ("Cook County Earned Sick Leave Ordinance"); and

WHEREAS, on October 26, 2016, the Cook County Board of Commissioners adopted an ordinance creating a minimum wage for employers in Cook County ("Cook County Minimum Wage Ordinance"); and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council of the City ("Corporate Authorities") find that the Cook County Earned Sick Leave and Minimum Wage Ordinances place an undue burden on employers within the City of Calumet City given the current rights of employees available under Federal and State Law; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities find that given the considerable number of businesses that employ individuals that are required to work across municipal and county borders within the Chicago metropolitan region and throughout the State of Illinois, the City believes that employment-related laws are best established at the Federal and State level; and

WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 6(c) of the Illinois Constitution provides that if a home rule county ordinance conflicts with an ordinance of a municipality, the municipal ordinance shall prevail within its jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to its home rule powers, the Corporate Authorities find it is in the best interest of the City to amend the Calumet City Municipal Code to clearly define the sick leave and minimum wage regulations that apply to employers located in the City of Calumet City as being those set forth in State and Federal Law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Calumet City, Cook County, Illinois, by and through its home rule powers, as follows:

**Section 1**. That the above recitals and legislative findings are found to be true and correct and are hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as if fully set forth in their entirety.

Section 2. Chapter 54 ("License and Permits and Miscellaneous Business Regulations"), Article I, ("In General") of the Municipal Code of the City of Calumet City is hereby amended by adding a new Section 54.1 to read, as follows:

# SECTION 54.1 – CONFLICTS WITH CERTAIN HOME RULE COUNTY ORDINANCES

- A. Employers located within the City shall comply with all applicable Federal and/or State laws and regulations as such laws and regulations may exist from time to time with regard to both the payment of minimum hourly wages and paid sick leave. Employee eligibility for paid sick leave and minimum hourly wages shall also be in compliance with all applicable Federal and/or State laws and regulations as such laws and regulations may exist from time to time.
- B. No additional obligations with regard to paid sick leave, or minimum hourly wages, including without limitation, any additional obligations by ordinance adopted by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, shall apply to employers located within the City, except those required by Federal and/or State laws and regulations as such laws and regulations may exist from time to time. The City opts out of any such ordinance(s) adopted by the Cook County Board of Commissioners, and this ordinance of the City conflicts with any such ordinance(s) adopted by the Cook County Board of Commissioners that imposes additional obligations with regard to paid sick leave or minimum hourly wages.
- C. For the purposes of this Section, the term "employee" means an individual permitted to work by an employer regardless of the number of persons the employer employs, and the term "employer" means any person employing one or more employees, or seeking to employ one or more employees, if the person has its principal place of business within the City or does business within the City.

- D. For the purposes of this Section, the term "employer" does not mean:
  - (a) The government of the United States or a corporation wholly owned by the government of the United States;
  - (b) An Indian tribe or a corporation wholly owned by an Indian tribe;
  - (c) The government of the State or any agency or department thereof; or
  - (d) The government of any municipality.

Section 3. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any other provision of this Ordinance.

Section 4. All ordinances, resolutions, motions or orders in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

Section 1. That Section 90-317 (Handicapped parking) of Article V [Stopping, Standing and Parking] of Chapter 90 [Traffic and Vehicles] of the Municipal Code of Calumet City, Illinois, is hereby amended by adding the following language to subsection G (Signed areas) to read, as follows:

### 1677 State Street

**Section 2.** The Commissioner of Streets and Alleys is hereby authorized and directed to install the proper signs in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Ordinance.

Section 3. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any other provision of this Ordinance.

**Section 4.** All ordinances, resolutions, motions or orders in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

**Section 5.** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

### ORDINANCE NO. 17- 25

# AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE PREVAILING WAGE STANDARDS IN THE CITY OF CALUMET CITY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois (the "State") has enacted the "Prevailing Wage Act," 820 ILCS 130/1 et seq. (the "Act") which is an act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workers employed in any public works by the State, county, city or any public body or any political subdivision or by anyone under contract for public works; and

WHEREAS, it is the policy of the State that a wage of no less than the general prevailing hourly rate as paid for work of a similar character in the locality in which the work is performed, shall be paid to all laborers, mechanics and other workers employed by or on behalf of any and all public bodies engaged in public works; and

WHEREAS, the Act requires that the City of Calumet City investigate and ascertain the prevailing rate of wages as defined in the Act for laborers, mechanics and other workers in the locality of the City of Calumet City employed in performing construction of public works, for the City of Calumet City; and

WHEREAS, the City of Calumet City has ascertained and examined the prevailing wage classifications and rates determined by the Department of Labor for Cook County for June 2015, which is the last available date wage rates were published by the Department of Labor.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Calumet City, Cook County, Illinois, as follows:

**SECTION 1:** That the above recitals and legislative findings are incorporated herein and made a part hereof.

SECTION 2: To the extent and as required by the Act, the general prevailing rates of wages in this locality for laborers, mechanics and other workers engaged in construction of public works coming under the jurisdiction of the City of Calumet City is hereby ascertained to be the

same as the prevailing rates of wages for construction work in the Cook County area, as determined by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois as of the month of June of the current year (See Exhibit "A").

**SECTION 3:** As required by the Act, any and all revisions of the prevailing rates of wages by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois shall supersede the Department's last publication of prevailing rates for construction work undertaken by the City of Calumet City. The definition of any terms appearing in the Ordinance which are also used in the Act shall be the same as in the Act.

**SECTION 4:** Nothing herein contained shall be construed to apply said general prevailing rate of wages as herein ascertained to any work or employment except public works construction undertaken by the City of Calumet City to the extent required by the Act.

SECTION 5: The City Clerk shall publicly post this determination or any revisions of such prevailing rate of wages, and keep it available for inspection at the Village Hall by any interested party. A copy of the determination or of the currently revised determination of the prevailing rate of wages then in effect shall be attached to all contract specifications.

**SECTION 6:** The City Clerk shall mail a copy of this determination to any employer, and to any association of employers and to any person or association of employees who have filed their names and addresses, and have requested copies of any determination stating the particular rates and the particular class of workers whose wages will be affected by such rates.

**SECTION 7:** The City Clerk shall promptly file a certified copy of this Ordinance with the Illinois Department of Labor, Prevailing Wage Division, One West Old State Capitol Plaza, Room 300, Springfield, IL 62701.

SECTION 8: Within thirty (30) days after the filing with the Department of Labor, the City Clerk shall cause a notice to be published in a newspaper of general circulation within the City stating:
