

AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE COMPENSATION FOR THE
MAYOR, CITY CLERK, CITY TREASURER AND ALDERMEN
OF THE CITY OF CALUMET CITY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Calumet City, Cook County, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION 1: That for the persons elected to the hereinafter-designated offices in the year 2001 the annual salary and compensation will be as follows:

<u>OFFICE</u>	<u>SALARY</u>
Mayor	\$54,000.00
City Clerk	\$48,000.00
City Treasurer	\$21,900.00
Aldermen	\$11,346.00

In addition to the salaries listed above, all elected officials will receive pay adjustments not to exceed the rate of inflation as determined by the United States Treasury Department, said inflation adjustments to take effect May 1, 2002 and each May 1 thereafter for the duration of the term of office.

SECTION 2: All salaries shall be paid in equal semi-monthly installments unless provision is made to the contrary by the City Council. The City Treasurer shall prepare a payroll list monthly which when signed by the Mayor, City Clerk and City Treasurer, shall authorize the issuance of checks for the salaries indicated to be due. Deductions as provided by law shall be made for pension funds, social security and withholding (income tax) and the like.

SECTION 3: Any elected official designated in Section 1 who attends a special council meeting and/or a special committee meeting shall be compensated for each meeting at the rate of one twenty-fourth (1/24) of the annual salary of aldermen as listed in Section 1.

SECTION 4: Elected officials shall receive the following monthly expense allowances:

Mayor	\$1625.00 per month
City Clerk	\$ 200.00 per month
City Treasurer	\$ 200.00 per month
Aldermen	\$ 700.00 per month

In addition to the above monthly expense allowances, the mayor shall receive a monthly car allowance of \$645.00. Expense allowances of elected officials will be accounted for under current Internal Revenue Code procedures for either accountable or non-accountable expenses. This section shall supersede Section 5 of Ordinance #00-41, effective May 1, 2001.

SECTION 5: That the Mayor of the City of Calumet City, in accordance with the laws of the State of Illinois and the ordinances of the City of Calumet City, shall act as Local Liquor Control Commissioner of the City of Calumet City, Illinois.

SECTION 6: That the Mayor as Local Liquor Control Commissioner of the City shall receive additional compensation in the amount of \$500.00 per month.

SECTION 7: That the City Clerk shall be appointed to hold the office of City Collector and no additional compensation shall be paid to the City Clerk for the performance of her duties as City Collector.

SECTION 8: That neither the Mayor, as President and member of the Board of Local Improvements, nor the City Clerk, as Secretary of the Board of Local Improvements, shall receive any additional compensation for performance of said duties.

SECTION 9: That the Aldermen hereafter appointed as members of the Board of Local Improvements of the City of Calumet City shall not receive any additional compensation for services as members of the Board of Local Improvements.

SECTION 10: That each Alderman who serves in the capacity of Chairman of a standing committee shall receive as additional compensation the sum of \$500.00 per month.

SECTION 11: That all Aldermen are allowed two (2) absences from regular meetings in each fiscal year for which compensation shall be paid at the rate herein provided.

SECTION 12: That an alderman may miss more than two (2) regular meetings per year and still receive payment at the rate herein set provided said Alderman can show due cause for such additional absence, such as illness of a member of the Alderman's immediate family, a death in the Alderman's immediate family or other like cause.

SECTION 13: That payment of the compensation herein provided shall be paid semi-monthly and deductions made as provided by law for pension funds, social security, withholding (income tax) and the like.

SECTION 14: That the elected official, without cost, while actively serving in an official capacity, shall be furnished health insurance coverage for themselves, spouse and children. Health insurance benefits provided to elected officials will be at least the same as that provided to active City employees. Officials that are elected to serve or commence a second term in office will be entitled to family health insurance until such time as the elected official becomes eligible for Medicare and supplemental insurance coverage or age 65, whichever occurs first. Elected officials upon retirement may be required to make a co-insurance contribution which shall not exceed co-insurance payments required of other City retirees.

SECTION 15: The Mayor shall be entitled to receive, at City expense, a whole, variable or term life insurance policy of \$500,000 (at inception) while in office. The cost of said policy shall not exceed 20% of the annual salary of the Mayor as determined herein or in any subsequent lawfully adopted ordinance. This provision shall only be modified with a three-fifths (3/5) vote of the City Council and a concurring vote from the Mayor.

SECTION 16: That the City Treasurer shall be entitled to up to \$350 per month to purchase life insurance of his or her choosing while in office, such insurance being whole, variable or term insurance.

SECTION 17: That other elected officials, other than the Mayor who is covered under Section 15, shall be entitled to up to \$250 per month to purchase life insurance of their choosing while in office, such insurance being whole, variable or term insurance.

SECTION 18: Should any provision of this Ordinance or any part thereof be invalid for any reason, such invalidity shall not affect the validity or affect any other section or part thereof.

SECTION 19: That all Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed.

SECTION 20: That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval as provided by law.
