To new clients:

Calumet City Resources is an *emergency* pantry for Calumet City residents – in operation for over twenty years. We are supported by the City of Calumet City, several churches, businesses and many generous individuals. Everyone who works for the Pantry is a volunteer.

When you come to the Pantry for the first time, you are asked to bring three pieces of identification showing your current Calumet City address.

- Photo ID
 - Examples of this are: a driver's license/Illinois ID/other photo ID
- 2 Pieces of current mail with name, address and dated within the last 60 days Examples of this are: current utility bill, lease, library card.

In the event you did not bring these on your first visit, we will definitely expect you to bring them on your next visit. Also, from time to time we will be updating our records and you will again be asked to bring <u>current</u> identification.

You are allowed to come to the Pantry once a month, on whatever day is convenient for you. We are open on Tuesday and Thursday mornings from 9:30 a.m. until 11:30 a.m.

We pay for most of the food we distribute, and we also receive food from the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA). The USDA has established the income levels for people receiving these foods, as indicated by the chart below. Each time you receive food, you will be asked to sign a form, which is then forwarded to the USDA, which affirms that you will fall within the guidelines they have set.

We accept donations of clean clothing and other miscellaneous items from concerned citizens. These are checked and sorted in our clothing room, and clients are free to see if there are things they can use. They must do this the same day they come for food.
