BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Calumet City, Cook County, Illinois, pursuant to its home rule powers, THAT:

A RESOLUTION APPROVING AND AUTHORZING EXECUTION OF A PRELIMINARY AND FINAL PLAT OF SUBDIVISION FOR NARCO RIVER BUSINESS CENTER FIRST RE-SUBDIVISION AND ACCEPTING DEDICATION TO THE CITY OF PARCEL 1 IN NARCO BUSINESS CENTER FIRST RE-SUBDIVISION

shall be, and is hereby, adopted as follows:

Section 1. BACKGROUND.

The University of Chicago Medical Center, formerly known as Ingalis Memorial Hospital, an Illinois Not-For-Profit Corporation ("Ingalis"), owns property in the City commonly known as the Narco River Business Center ("Subdivision"). Ingalis desires to resubdivide the Subdivision into new parcels and lots and dedicate one newly designated parcel to the City. The City desires to approve the resubdivision of the Subdivision to be known as the Narco River Business Center First Resubdivision ("Resubdivision") and accept the dedication of Parcel 1 in the Resubdivision.

Section 2. APPROVALS: AUTHORIZATIONS: RECORDATION.

A. Preliminary and Final Subdivision Plat.

- 1. <u>Approvai</u>. The Preliminary and Final Plat of Subdivision for Narco River Business Center First Resubdivision prepared by Manhard Consulting, consisting of two sheets, with a latest revision date of July 14, 2021, is approved in substantially the form of *Exhibit A* attached to and, by this reference, made a part of this Resolution ("*Plat of Subdivision*").
- 2. <u>Authorizations</u>. The Mayor and City Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to execute and seal, on behalf of the City, the Plat of Subdivision only after receipt of at least three fully executed copies of the Plat of Subdivision by ingalls; provided, however, that if the three fully executed copies of the Plat of Subdivision are not submitted to the Village within 90 days after the adoption of this Resolution, this authority to execute and seal will, at the option of the Board of Trustees, be null and void.
- 3. <u>Recordation</u>. The City will cause to be recorded and pay all costs associated with the recordation the Plat of Subdivision with the Office of the Cook County Recorder upon satisfactory completion of all administrative details relating thereto, and as provided in this Resolution.
- B. <u>Dedication and Acceptance of Parcel 1 in Resubdivision; Conditions; Recordation of Deed.</u>
 - 1. <u>Dedication and Acceptance</u>. The City hereby accepts the dedication by Ingalls of Parcel 1 in the Resubdivision as depicted on the Plat of Subdivision approved in

Subsection 2.A.1 of this Resolution and pursuant to the terms of the Warranty Deed attached to and, by this reference made a part of this Resolution as *Exhibit B*.

- 2. <u>Conditions</u>. The acceptance of the dedication by the City of Parcel 1 in the Resubdivision is specifically conditioned on the following:
 - a. Removal of title exemption Item 15 from the Greater Illinois Title Company 2016 Alta Owners Policy Title Commitment, as shown on the 2016 Alta Owner's Policy Title Commitment dated June 17, 2021.
 - b. Full payment by Ingalls of all second half 2020 property taxes, and any other outstanding charges, fees, costs or penalties that may be due and owing for part of or all of the property depicted on the Plat of Subdivision while ingalls was fee simple title owner of the property.
 - c. Issuance of and delivery to the City within ten business days of the approval date of this Resolution of a 2016 Alta Owner's Policy by Greater Illinois Title Company, procured and paid for by the City in the City's name for the full market value of Parcel 1 in the Resubdivision.
 - d. Issuance of and delivery to the City within seven business days of the approval date of this Resolution of a certified land title survey for Parcel 1 in the Resubdivision, prepared in accordance with the Minimum Standard Detail Requirements for Land Title Surveys adopted by the American Land Title Association and the American Congress on Surveying and Mapping.
 - e. The proper recording the Reciprocal Easement Agreement between the parties with the Office of the Cook County Clerk simultaneous with the recording of the conveyance deed.
- 3. Recordation. The City will cause and pay all costs associated with the recordation the Warranty Deed and the Reciprocal Easement Agreement with the Office of the Cook County Clerk upon satisfactory completion of all administrative details relating thereto, and as provided in this Resolution.

Section 3. FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH CONDITIONS.

Upon failure or refusal of Ingalls to comply with any or all of the conditions, restrictions, or provisions of this Resolution, the acceptance of the dedication of Parcel 1 in the Resubdivision approved in Section 3 of this Resolution (collectively, "Conditioned Approvals"), will, at the sole discretion of the City Council, by Resolution duly adopted, be revoked and become null and void.

Section 4. EFFECTIVE DATE.

- A. This Resolution will be effective upon the occurrence of the following events:
 - 1. passage by the City Council by a majority vote in the manner required by law;

- 2. publication in pamphlet form in the manner required by law;
- 3. satisfaction of all conditions set forth in Subsection 2.B.2 of this Resolution; and
- 4. the recordation of this Resolution together with any exhibits as the City Clerk deems appropriate for recordation in the Office of the County County Recorder. The Petitioner will bear the full cost of this recordation.


