

Expanded Study Area


• Little Calumet River to 130th Street Interchange

Project Area


- North to South: Little Calumet River to 154th Street





Crash History

- 5- year period (2018 2022)
- 833 Total Crashes
- 1 Fatal Crash
- 22 Severe Type A Injury Crashes
- Rear End, Sideswipe, Turning & Fixed
 Object crash types are the majority
- 55% daytime / 45% night
- 78% dry / 22% wet | ice | snow




Crash History By Location

2018-2022


INJURY CRASH DEFINITIONS

- Type Ais an incapacitating injury
- Type Bis a nonincapacitating injury
- Type Cis an injury reported but not evident
- PDOis a property damage only crash / non-injury crash



Crash History

- Crashes by Location
- 688 Crashes on 194 & Ramps
- 125 Crashes Dolton Road/Ave
- 20 Crashes Local Streets
- Severe Injury Crashes on Dolton Road disproportionate to existing traffic volumes
- Severe Type A Injury Crashes
 - 13 Dolton Road / Local Roads
 - \cdot 9 I/94 (Bishop Ford Fwy)





Existing Traffic Volumes

Roadway	Existing Average Daily Traffic (2023)	Projected Average Daily Traffic (2050)	Change (%)
Dolton Rd / Ave	14,700	17,200 to 18,000	+17% to +22%
I- 94 (Bishop Ford Fwy)	136,200 to 156,300	140,600 to 161,500	+3%
Ramp A	4,600	4,600	0%
Ramp B	5,600	6,300	+13%
Ramp C	6,400	6,700	+5%
Ramp D	3,500	3,800	+9%

Units = vehicles per day (vpd)





What is the average vehicle speed observed on Dolton Road? The posted speed limit is 35mph.



Existing Vehicle Speeds on Dolton Road

- Data Collection— 24-hour period
- Posted Speed Limit = 35mph
- Average Observed Speed = 44mph
- 10% of total traffic exceeding 53mph
- 76 vehicles ≥ 65mph
- Max Speed Observed = 89mph
- 13% of total traffic traveling at or below posted speed


